# Net bag with fabric lining

**SIZE** (measured front)

**Width** approx. 35 cm

**Height** (with handles) approx. 64 cm

## MATERIALS

**Schachenmayr #netzporter**, 250 g ball

approx. 250 g = 375 m

Col. 00035 (pink) 1 ball

For the lining:

140 m MEZfabrics from the collection „Nordic Garden Dream“ by Arne & Carlos, 100% cotton, 35 cm wide

MEZ Duet sewing yarn in matching color

1 crochet hook, 4.0 mm

1 crochet hook, 5.0 mm

1 tapestry needle for weaving in ends

## ABBREVIATIONS:

st = stitch

sc = single crochet

slst = slip stitch

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

hdc = half double crochet

st(s) = stitch(es)

rnd(s) = round(s)

tc = treble crochet

## GAUGE

### Net pattern:

Size 5.0 mm needle 18 st and 4 rounds = 10 x 10 cm

Adjust your needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

## BASIC PATTERN

### Basic pattern

Work the base of the bag in rounds of dc.

Start every rnd with 3 ch for 1 dc and end with 1 sl st in the 3rd ch from the beginning of the rnd.

## Net pattern

Start every rnd with 4 ch for 1 tc and end with 1 sl st in the 4th ch from the beginning of the rnd.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 4, then \* ch 3, sk 3, 1 tc, rep continuously from \*. Close rnd with 3 ch, skip 3 and 1 sl st.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 4, ch 1, then \* 1 tc around the next ch arch, ch 3, rep continuously from \*. Close rnd with 1 tc, 1 ch and 1 sl st.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 4, then \* ch 3, 1 tc around the next ch arch, rep continuously from \*.

Close rnd with 3 ch and 1 sl st.

Repeat rnd 2 and 3 continuously.

## INSTRUCTIONS

### Base

Work 3 ch and 11 dc in a magic ring using crochet hook G/6 (4.0 mm).

Close rnd with 1 sl st in the 3rd ch. (= 12 st).

**Rnd 1:** Increase every st (= 24 st).

**Rnd 2:** Increase every other st (= 36 st).

**Rnd 3:** Increase every third st (= 48 st).

**Rnd 4–11:** Increase the rnd according to this pattern (= 144 st after rnd 11).

**Rnd 12:** Increase every 18th st (= 152 st).

**Rnd 13:** Work 1 dc in every st (= 152 st).

Switch to hook H/8 (5 mm).

**Rnd 14:** Ch 4, (= 1 tc), then \* ch 3, sk 3, 1 tc, rep continuously from \*. Close rnd with 3 ch, skip 3 and 1 sl st in the 4th ch. (= 152 st).

**Rnd 15:** Ch 4, (= 1 tc), ch 1, then \* 1 tc around the next ch arch, ch 3, rep continuously from \*. Close rnd with 1 tc, 1 ch and 1 sl st in the 4th ch. (= 152 st).

**Rnd 16:** Ch 4, (= 1 tc) then \* ch 3, 1 tc around the next ch arch, rep continuously from \*.

Close rnd with 3 ch and 1 sl st in the 4th ch (= 152 st).

Rep rnds 15 and 16 four times.

Draw through and secure all threads.

### Part 1 final border

Switch to back to hook G/6 (5 mm), start with new yarn on the 7th ch arch and work as follows:

**Row 1:** Work 4 sc around each of the following ch 7 arches, skip the tc. 1 tch, turn over (= 28 st).

**Rows 2–7:** Work 1 sc in every st, 1 tch, turn over (= 28 st).



After the last row, skip the tch and draw through.

Cut the yarn.

Sk the ch 12 arch, start with new yarn and repeat rows 1–7.

Do not cut the yarn, instead continue working as follows:

### Part 2 final border with handles

**Rnd 1:** 7 sc (in the outer st of the previously worked row 7), 3 sc around each of the following ch 12 arches, 7 sc (in the outer st of the previously worked row 7), ch 70 (= 1st handle), sk 28, 7 sc (in the outer st of the previously worked row 7), 3 sc around each of the following ch 12 arches, 7 sc (in the outer st of the previously worked row 7), ch 70 (= 2nd handle), sk 28, (= 240 st).

Continue working in spiral rounds and add a stitch marker so you know where you are.

**Rnd 2–7:** Work 1 sc in every st.

After the last rnd, work 1 sl st in next sc (= 240 st).

### FINISHING OFF

Draw through and weave in all ends with a darning needle.

### CUTTING OUT THE LINING

Tip: The sizes given here are based on the gauge in the crochet instructions. Before you cut, we recommend measuring the crocheted net bag and adjusting the size of the pattern pieces if necessary.

For the circumference of the bag, add a 2.5 cm seam allowance to determine the width of the rectangle and add a 1.5 cm seam allowance in height and diameter.

Lining body: 1 rectangle 89.5 x 34.5 cm

Lining base: 1 circle Ø 33 cm

### LINING SEWING INSTRUCTIONS:

Tip: If not mentioned otherwise, all measurements include a 0.75 cm seam allowance.

**1.** Lining body: The body of the lining is sewn together with a fell seam.

Place the rectangle right sides together so that the narrow end on the lower half sticks out approx. 0.75 cm below the narrow end on the top half.

Sew the narrow ends together with a seam allowance just less 0.75 cm away from the narrow end on the top.

**2.** Place the wide seam allowance over the narrower one just before the seam and iron the fold line.

**3.** Open up and iron the seam so that the open edge of the folded over seam allowance is on the inside and is covered.

Sew close to the edge along the fold line.

This neatens the seam at the same time.

**4.** Fold the resulting tube in half so that the seam is on one side and mark the middle on the other side.

Unfold the tube and fold again so that the mark you made is on the middle of the seam.

Mark the side middle points.

**5.** Sew the lining body to the base.

Fold the circle for the base in half and mark the middle of both sides.

Fold open and then refold so that the marks are on top of each other.

Mark the side middle points.

Pin the body of the lining to the base so that the marks marry up.

If necessary, you can add a little fold to prevent excess width.

Sew together all the way round.

Finally, neaten the seam allowance with an overlocker or zig-zag stitch.

### FINISHING OFF

Draw the yarn through the crocheted net and weave in all ends with a darning needle.

Fold the upper open edge of the lining 0.75 cm to the right and iron.

Place the lining in the net bag so that the right side faces outwards towards the net and the ironed over edges are approx. 1 cm below the upper crochet edge.

Sew the lining on close to the edge along. Sew the base into the bottom of the crocheted bag right next to the seam between the base and the body of the lining.
