Mystic Gnome

KNOTS USED:

Overhand Knot **Square Knot** Horizontal double half hitch knot

(see at the end step by step tutorials for these knots)

BEFORE STARTING

Cut the following:

- 1 x 1m rope colour 00119
- 5 x 80cm ropes colour 00119
- 4 x 20cm ropes colour 00105
- 4 x 25cm ropes colour 00105
- 2 x 30cm ropes colour 00105
- 4 x 20cm Silver Metallic yarn colour 00301
- 4 x 25cm Silver Metallic yarn colour 00301
- 2 x 30cm Silver Metallic yarn colour 00301

STEP 1: Take 1 x 1m rope colour 00119, fold in half and tie one overhand knot creating a loop at one end. Make length of loop 8cm. (TIP: You may wish to use masking tape and stick the loop down onto a surface, making it easier to work the knots in the next steps).



STEP 2: Take 1 x 80cm rope colour 00119 and tie one Square Knot under the overhand knot.







STEP 3: Take 1 x 80cm rope colour 00119 and attach to the filler cords on the left, tying one **Square Knot**, directly beneath the **Square Knot**. Repeat this step to the filler cords on the right.

STEP 4: Take cords 3-6 and tie one Square Knot, directly beneath the Square Knots in Step 3.



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STEP 5: Take cords 1-4 and tie one **Square Knot**, directly beneath the **Square Knot** made in Step 4. Repeat for cords 5-8.

STEP 6: Take 1 x 80cm rope colour 00119 and attach to the filler cords on the left, tying one **Square Knot**, directly beneath the **Square Knots** in Step 5

STEP 7: Take cords 5-8 and tie a **Square Knot**. Repeat Step 6 to the filler cords on the right.

STEP 8: Take cords 3-6 and tie one **Square Knot**, directly beneath the **Square Knots** made in Step 6-7. Repeat for cords 7-10.

STEP 9: Take cords 1-4 and tie one **Square Knot** directly beneath the **Square Knots** made in Step 8. Repeat for cords 5-8 and 9-12.



STEP 10: Starting on the left, tie a row of eleven Horizontal double half hitch Knots. Leave a gap of 1cm and start a new row, tying four Horizontal double half hitch Knots. Using a darning needle, thread the wooden bead onto cords 6-7. From cord 5 continue to tie seven Horizontal double half hitch Knots, securing the bead as you tie the row of knots.







STEP 11: Take cords 1-2 and tie a **overhand knot** to secure. Repeat for cords 3-4, 5-6, 7-8, 9-10 and 11-12. Cut off any excess cord.







STEP 12: Take $2 \times 20 \text{cm}$ natural cord , use a comb and brush until cords are frayed. Use a darning needle and tie a Rya Knot to cords 1-2.







STEP 13: Take 2 x 25cm ropes colour 00105, use a comb and brush until cords are frayed. Use a darning needle and tie a **Rya Knot** to cords 3-4. STEP 14: Take 2 x 30cm rope colour 00105, use a comb and brush until cords are frayed. Use a darning needle and tie a **Rya Knot** to cords 5 & 8. Make sure the wooden bead sits in front between this knot. Repeat Step 13 for cords 9-10. Repeat Step 12 for cords 11-12.

STEP 15: Starting on the left with the first Rya Knot. Use a darning needle to attach 2 x 20cm silver metallic yarn using the Rya Knot technique. For the 2nd Rya Knot attach 2 x 25cm silver metallic yarn. For the 3rd Rya Knot attach 1 x 30cm silver metallic yarn to cords 5 & 8. Make sure the wooden bead sits in front between cords. For the 4th Rya knot attach 2 x 25cm silver metallic yarn. For the 5th Rya knot attach 2 x 20cm silver metallic yarn

STEP 16: Take a comb and gently brush each Rya Knot, so it creates a soft frayed finish. Use scissors and cut a diagonal line on the left and then the right, creating a V shape.







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SQUARE KNOT - SQUARE KNOT BAND

Step 1: The 4 filler and working strands are arranged parallel, the working strands A and D are on the outside and the filler strands B/C are in the middle.

Step 2: Place D from right to left over B/C and under A.

Step 3: Bring A from left to right under B/C.

Step 4: Pull A from the back to the front though the loop created by D.

Step 5: Carefully pull A and D tightly.


The first basic knot is finished = 1 half square knot.

Step 6: Place D from left to right over B/C and under A

Step 7: Bring A from right to left under B/C. Pull A from the back to the front though the loop created by D.

Carefully pull A and D tightly.

The second basic knot is finished = 1 square knot.



Step 1

OVERHAND KNOT

The overhand knot can be made with one cord or with a group of cords.

Step 1: Take the end of the cord from the bottom to the top and bring it to the left behind the vertical cord.

Bring the end of the cord down through the loop you just created.

Pull the knot tight.


HORIZONTAL DOUBLE HALF HITCH KNOT


From left to right


Step 1: An additional cord (red) is used as the working cord; the filler cord (black) hangs down horizontally. Loop the working cord around the filler cord vertically from the left.

Step 2: Loop the working cord around the filler cord again.

Step 3: Gently pull the working cord tightly and push both loops together. Multiple knots horizontally next to each other







Note: Due to the fact, that Crafty Fine yarn is recycled from colour-assorted textile material and not re-dyed there can be slight variations in color and thickness. We therefore recommend buying enough yarn for your project. We also advise to use a crochet needle without handle, which is easier to work with. The first stitches might be a little bit hard to work, but you will soon get used, and the final result is worth it.

WASHING ADVICE

Always wash in as warm a water temperature as possible - up to the temperature recommended, with a short spin. Use a lot of water if hand washing. For darker colours we recommend the use of discolouration sheets. Do not bleach.

Do not tumble dry. Drip-dry on a horizontal surface. Iron on a hot temperature setting using a damp cloth. Professional dry cleaning in tetrachloroethylene.
